As he grew, Pier Georgio worked to bring the love of Jesus to the poor and needy. Secretly, he began using his money to buy food for poor families and medicine for the sick. He spent much of his time helping the needy, especially those who were sick.

Without concern for his own health, he loved the sick – and, eventually, he contracted polio. When he was dying, his only concern was that one of his sick friends get his medicine. At his funeral, everyone expected the many dignitaries and rich who showed up; but nobody expected the thousands of poor – unknown to his family – who lined the streets to say goodbye; people with no idea this young man who had loved them so generously for the past seven years was a member of such an influential
